

# Childcare Assistance (CAP) Scholarships

#### 2024-2025 ACADEMIC YEAR

The CAP (Childcare Assistance Program) Scholarship is administered by the ISU Office of Child Care and Family Services. Scholarships are awarded for Fall and Spring semesters to assist in reimbursement for out-of-pocket costs for child care services.

The CAP-U scholarship is awarded to U.S. citizens or permanent residents currently enrolled in degree seeking coursework as an undergraduate student. Applications demonstrating highest financial need receive priority. CAP-U scholarship applications are accepted through May 1, 2025

The CAP-G scholarship is awarded to graduate or professional students or international undergraduate students currently enrolled in degree seeking coursework. Applications demonstrating highest financial need receive priority. CAP-G scholarship applications are **due by September 30, 2024** 

Evaluation criteria includes credit load, tuition costs, family size, age of child, and other child care financial assistance being received.
